Technology & parenting

What rules should you have around digital devices? By Michael Grose Part 1

Children's digital technology needs to be managed and monitored by parents. That means we need to have some rules and guidelines in place.



I'm often asked about rules and guidelines for children in the early and primary school years about digital devices such as tablets and mobile phones. This is new ground for most people whose own parents didn't have to worry about digital technology. How to persuade kids to leave the television and play outside was the extent of the screen worries of the previous generations of parents.

One thing is certain, technology is an issue you'll struggle with for the rest of your parenting life. We've created the technology and unleashed it on our kids and now we seem to be scrambling like mad to keep up. Adding to this complexity is the fact that technology keeps changing rapidly. We just come to grips with one device when a new one comes along that we have to learn about.

Digital technology, with all its advantages, is here to stay. It connects us to each other in ways we couldn't imagine even a decade ago. It enables us to communicate to our kids when we don't know where they are. It creates new interests and cultivates creativity.

You'd have to be living under a rock to not realise that digital technology also presents new challenges such as cyberbullying, worries about social media and children's exposure to inappropriate images. Digital devices give kids access to a virtual world that is totally seductive particularly for those with poor impulse control. Also, the nature of technology means that children can spend a lot of their time heads bent and staring into a screen, which is not healthy in the long-term.

CHILDREN'S CHATTER MATTERS

Language Learning activities to have a go at home.

Ten activities will be provided over Term Three to help your child think a little bit deeper about the world around them and to use longer and more complex sentences. Expanding your child's oral language use will lead to significant improvements in their writing also. You may need to adjust the activity to suit your child's level:

** Encourage your child to include the following parts when retelling a story/experience: who/ where/ when/ what happened/ feelings/ why. Encourage them to use some joining words such as because, if, when, but, so, however, until, or, unless, then, consequently, before, after, as, instead of. You might like to start a sentence for them to finish.



e.g. Just after breakfast, my brother and I had a fight. He used my Spongebob toothbrush. Yuck!!! I hate it when he uses my Spongebob toothbrush because his breath stinks. Mum wasn't very pleased with us and said we couldn't have a treat after school.















Your teacher will have access to each of these cue cards for you to print off and use to guide your child's language at home.

Lincoln visits Sacred Heart

Lincoln Budge is an inspiring young man who grew up in country Victoria. On the weekend of his 22nd birthday, he was a passenger in a serious car accident that left him a paraplegic. As Lincoln recovered in rehabilitation he made the decision to use every muscle that still worked to its maximum potential, in turn making life full of as much fun and new experiences as he can muster. Lincoln has done just this and more after his accident, exceeding his early expectations of life in a wheelchair and improving the lives of all who meet him. Last week Lincoln visited Sacred Heart Primary school and Sacred Heart College. After sharing his experiences, focussing on his abilities rather than his disabilities Lincoln gets the students and teachers in the wheelchairs for a game of basketball. This is a fun and inclusive experience that gets everyone really thinking of the challenges of being in a chair for life. This can be a life changing experience for many, and can do more to change attitudes than any words can. Teacher Christine Cussen, who was instrumental in getting Lincoln to visit the school said, "This was such a valuable experience, it promotes understanding and enhances inclusion for all. The children gain confidence around being with people in wheelchairs and our community is better off for Lincoln's visit." COMING IN WEEK 7- FREE DENTAL CHECK UP

Sacred Heart Primary School is collaborating with Smiles Onsite to promote healthier, happier smiles at our school! This incredible service is being offered for FREE under the federal government's Child Dental Benefits Schedule (CDBS), and comes along with the chance to grab some amazing prizes.

All students will be given a consent form to bring home so that they can participate, and also so that they can go in the draw to win prizes!!

How does it work?

The Child Dental Benefit Schedule grants all eligible parents with \$1000 worth of Medicare towards dental per child, over a two-year period. Eligible parents should receive a confirmation letter; however if you are still unsure, Smiles Onsite can check for you on completion of their consent form.

Can I make use of this service if I'm not eligible?


Of course! Smiles Onsite can do almost everything that your local dentist can do on board there state-of-the-art mobile Clinic. If you would like them to see your child for a scale and clean, fillings, fissure seals etc., these services can be offered with NO GAP payable.
