

Good Afternoon Everyone

Our Book Week has started with a bang! Maid Marion is cruising our corridors exciting our student with tales of adventure and excitement. Tomorrow we will be holding our annual book parade. I am looking forward to see everyone in costume.

As mentioned in our last newsletter Karen Starkiss has been working within our school, providing staff with feedback, identifying gaps in our practice and attending our planning meetings. Her expert advice has been invaluable for our whole staff and provided us many ideas to enable best practice for all our learners.

Respectful Relationships is a new Social and Emotional Program, which has been introduced by the Victorian Government that we will be beginning to teach in our classes. The aims of the program are for students to understand feelings and how our behaviours impact others and ourselves. The program also focuses on student attention, on building resilience and respect for others, especially in relation to gender equity. The overarching aim of the program is to reduce the alarming rates of family violence in Australia. 1 in 5 women in Australia experience family violence during their life. Learning about equity and respect for all, starts with education. The Victorian Government has introduced the program for schools in the attempt to address this major issue that our society faces. Staff will be attending Professional Development course on the 4th September to learn about how the program can be best introduced to the whole school. The program will include lessons about emotions and reactions, resilience and respect. Research has proven that if this particular program is supported by the whole school community and is embraced by our staff and students, learning conditions become optimal and there can be an 11% increase in academic learning growth.

The following article, which is Part 3, is very topical and leads to a lot of discussion amongst parents, teachers and children.

Technology & Parenting- What rules should you have around digital devices? By Michael Grose Part 3

Children's digital technology needs to be managed and monitored by parents. That means we need to have some rules and guidelines in place. Each family makes up their own rules to suit their circumstances but the following suggestions will help you put some order into the digital devices that come into your home.



4. Change rules if need be

Most families seem to have a child who thinks that rules are made to be broken so they always push boundaries, limits and parent patience. Parents, on the other hand, should work from the notion that rules are made to be changed. Be prepared to change your rules based on your child's behaviour, maturity, sleep patterns, incompletion of homework, bullying or other issues that will invariably crop up and cause you to realise that the rules you set just aren't working.

5. Keep digital technology out of bedrooms

If there was one rule that you should stay firm on, then this is the one. Many of our children are in sleep deficit as it is, without bringing digital devices into the frame. They may say they want to charge it in their room. If so, keep the charger in a public place. They may even want to use their mobile or tablet to wake up in the morning. I applaud them for taking on this task but insist they use an alarm clock instead.

6. Have a digital detox one day a week

The only way that this idea will work is if you join them in making one day a week a digital technology free day. They will probably not like it, and neither will you, but the point of having one day off is to prove that they can live without their digital device and to engage them in different forms of communication and entertainment.

Digital technology is now an integral part of our lives, but it's not the only option we have to be entertained, informed and to communicate with others. Before we help our children, it's best to look at own digital habits to make sure we are providing them with what they need – that is, the provision of balanced role models who know when to use, and when not to use, technology. They are more likely to walk our walk than follow our talk. I hope for you that's not a scary proposition.

CHILDREN'S CHATTER MATTERS

Language Learning activities to have a go at home.

Ten activities will be provided over Term Three to help your child think a little bit deeper about the world around them and to use longer and more complex sentences. Expanding your child's oral language use will lead to significant improvements in their writing also. You may need to adjust the activity to suit your child's level:

** It is important for your child to make longer sentences by joining two smaller sentences together. This can be achieved by using conjunctions/joining words. We use the conjunctions *but, however, whereas* to help to *compare* two things. Play 'spot the difference' with your child and get them to generate sentences while comparing the pictures. For instance:







This picture has 2 sheep HOWEVER that picture has 1 pig and 1 sheep.

This picture has chickens WHEREAS this picture has eggs. Spot the difference books can be purchased from newsagents or go to www.spotthedifference.com for extra resources.
