## CRAZY HAIR Day- This Friday 7th November

On Nov 3<sup>rd</sup>, Tom Dunn will begin his approx.40 day kayaking trip along the Murray River that will raise money for The Aurora Foundation. This organisation was chosen to be the benefactor of our donation collections as it is a charity of personal significance. The Dunn family was supported immensely by the Aurora Foundation's when Cate (Tom's sister) was diagnosed as profoundly deaf. As a rurally located family with no prior personal knowledge or experience surrounding the disability, they were left with no ideas on how to support a deaf child. Thanks to the assistance of Aurora, Cate herself that is now in a position where she functions normally, has no noticeable speech defect, and in her eyes has no disability. The Aurora Foundation has helped Cate to break away from the stereotypes that children with this disability are subjected to, and has improved the quality of life she will now experience – for that, we cannot describe the gratitude towards this organisation. We hope that that all families learning to support a child with deafness can share in the support and care we have received from this organisation - unfortunately, however, the opportunity is not always available. Therefore the money that we raise will be put towards allowing rural deaf children and families, who may find themselves in the same position as the Dunn family were in, to seek out Aurora's assistance with early development and to help allow these children to live out their dreams and desires and reach their full potential, as Cate has done (Luke Doyle, Sacred Heart College)




### Windsurfing
