One way to help your child achieve at school is to work together with your child's teacher. The parent-teacher partnership takes work from both sides to become a reality. Here are some ideas that will help.

There's no doubt that the best outcomes for kids happen when teachers and parents work together to support children's learning.

There's no doubt that the best outcomes for kids happen when teachers and parents work together to support children's learning. Here are the 10 headings I've included this term for the ways you can work with your child's teacher to maximise your child's chances of school success.

1. **Know what your child's teacher is trying to achieve**
2. **Keep your expectations reasonable and positive**
3. **Support your teacher's expectations & activities at home**
4. **Send kids to school ready to learn and on time**
5. **Inform teachers of your child's challenges and changes**
6. **Skill children to work with others**
7. **Respectfully seek joint solutions to problems and difficulties**
8. **Participate fully in class & school activities**
9. **Trust your teacher's knowledge, professionalism and experience**
10. **Talk up what happens at school**

This type of 10-point plan is easy to read but hard to put into practise, particularly when you get busy or your child has significant difficulties. Choose two or three ideas from this list to really focus on in the coming year and you'll find that the rest will fall into place. Good luck and nurture the partnerships you have with your child's teachers.



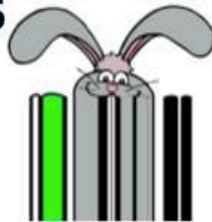
