Our Breakfast Club is held each Wednesday and Friday mornings, before school. Our dedicated and hard-working St Vinnie's volunteers would be very grateful of some help during the 'rush' time of 8:15am till 8:45am. **If you are able to offer some assistance please drop in and see them.** The Breakfast Club operates from the canteen.

'Together Time' as a way to improve behaviours in children – Research suggests that it is beneficial to allocate **10 minutes** per day of 1:1, uninterrupted time for parents to give their full attention to their child. This should be a child-directed activity in which the parent is fully engaged. The benefits of together time are many:

- It builds a warm relationship and creates positive experiences between the child and parent
- Research has shown that children have fewer behavioural problems if parents play with them when they are young
- Provides opportunities to help children to solve problems and learn to communicate their thoughts, feelings and needs
- Helps to build children's self-confidence

Points to remember about together time with your child:

- Follow your child's suggestion and interests for the activity
- Don't make too many demands
- Don't compete with your child
- Praise and encourage your child's ideas and creativity; don't criticise
- Be an attentive and appreciative audience
- Notice your child's accomplishments and help them feel important
- Curb your desire to give too much help; encourage your child's problem-solving
- Show enthusiasm for the special time you spend with your child
- Laugh and have fun

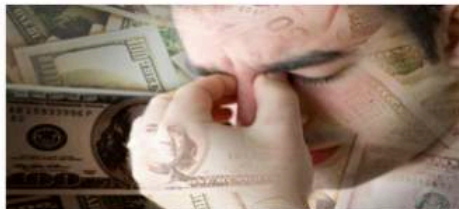
