Our school Library Computer Package has updated to Oliver Junior 5.

This means that our Apple Macs are compatible with the school Library software-Oliver Junior 5. One module of this new technology allows staff and students to search for resources housed in the school library, and as well for staff, resources housed in the Religious Education area, the Reading Room which houses Big Books and Guided readers for the school and the Teacher Reference area and resources located for specific learning areas. Students may view library resources from home as well as at school using our school website and then following the school library link. The module is called Orbit. Mr. Ashley Wheaton, our ICT leader has managed all parts of this update and my thanks go to Ashley for managing this work. My thanks go to Mr. Paul Maher for providing funds for this ICT update.

We now have a Library search engine that allows equity of use.

Writing Tips Reading AT Home

It is the expectation that children in the Discovery Centre are reading for a minimum of 10 minutes each night during the school week. We encourage the children to, where possible read on the weekends. We understand that there will be times, in our busy lives where children will miss a night's reading. We are however, quite concerned with the number of children not reading and not filling in their logbooks. If your child read 4 nights for the 6 weeks of reading in Term One and 4 weeks of Term Two, they would have read a minimum of 40 nights. It is guite alarming how many children have not reached this milestone. There is no set homework in the Discovery Centre other than 10 minutes of reading. We are asking families to be more diligent with this for the remainder of the term. We ask that all students return their take home readers log books on a Friday so we can check how they are going. Reading at home is essential in the home/school partnership and is an important aspect in improving this essential life skill. Thank you to those families who have been consistent throughout the year so far!

Science Afternoons




NAPLAN
