#### Serious Concerns Regarding Government funding to Catholic Schools

On Tuesday of this week, PM Turnbull and Education Minister Birmingham announced significant changes to funding to schools across Australia. The new funding program was developed with very limited consultation with education leaders and the Catholic sector was able to voice its concerns only 24 hours before the announcement took place. As a result, it is clear from all reports that the new funding structure disadvantages Catholic schools.

Catholic Education across the nation educates approximately 25% of students. Why any government would choose not to equally support all schools defies logic, but to openly create a system which disadvantages one sector is unjust. Sandhurst Director of Catholic Education, Mr Paul Desmond has said that parents, Principals and school staff are assured that the Catholic Education Commission of Victoria will continue the campaign which will convince the Turnbull Government that the new funding arrangements are unfair and need to be changed.

If you hold a health care card please let Heather or myself know as you will be eligible for Government Assistance.

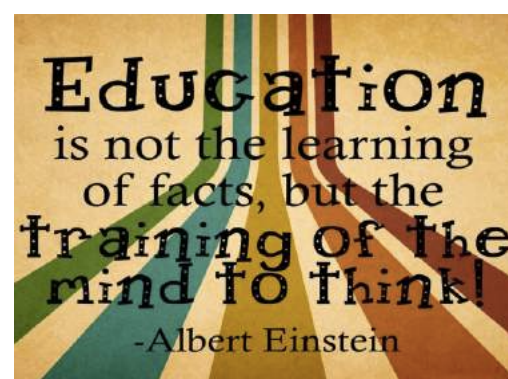
#### Sacraments of Confirmation and Eucharist

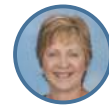

### Taming temper tantrums

*Practical ideas for parents to help manage temper tantrums and decrease their frequency.*

Tantrums come in various guises and have various names including wobbles, tanties and hissy fits to name a few. They can be loud and noisy with lots of shouting and yelling. They can be quite physical when doors are slammed and objects thrown. And they can be the silent kind that involves sulking, which can be just as difficult to manage as the more overt kinds. *Kids of all ages throw them* but the frequency is a little higher in the toddler and teenage age groups.



### So, what are tantrums about?

There are two types of tantrums that kids throw. The **first type** is a *frustration tantrum*. Children can become frustrated easily when they can't do things, or can't get the words out so they act out. This is a way of getting rid of your frustrations, that most of us grow out of. It may be valid for a four-year-old to throw their shoes in the air in frustration because they can't tie up the laces but it's not exactly mature behaviour when an adult tosses his work in the air when things don't go his way at work. But it happens! When kids throw a frustration tantrum adults need to contain the tantrum, give them space or even give them a hug until they have calmed down.

There is **another type** of tantrum that comes from a different space altogether: a *control tantrum*. These are the wobbles kids throw when things don't go their way. When they want to demonstrate their disapproval, or get what they want, a tantrum magically appears. These tantrums are a form of emotional blackmail that are very effective in helping kids get their own way.

Control tantrums require an audience – the bigger the better, so supermarkets and other public places make great places where children can throw a 'wobbly'. Children and teenagers may throw tantrums in their bedrooms, too, but they are always loud enough for parents to hear. They are often thrown just at a time when it's hard to resist, such as when you are racing out to work in the morning, and you haven't time to deal with them.

### CHILDREN'S CHATTER MATTERS

Language Learning activities to have a go with, at home.

Ten activities will be provided over Term Two to help develop your child's vocabulary at home (you may need to adjust the activity to suit your child's level). See if you can think of more activities!

\*\* One person gives two pieces of information that describe something they have pictured in their mind, making sure there is more than one possible answer.

The other person/people must figure out what you are thinking of. They may request additional information to prompt.

For example:

'It is round and used for cooking' could be a saucepan, frying pan, cake tin...

'It has legs and a back' could be a chair, dog, person...

'It has a long handle and you use it in the outside' could be a rake, shovel, broom
