Dear Parents,

Last night we held our Parent Information Session for this year's Sacrament of Reconciliation. I'd like to thank all those people who attended the evening and were able to gather with their family groups to arrange their meetings. At Sacred Heart we are 100% committed to our 'Home-Based Program'. We place great value on this approach where parents can work through the program and have quality one-on-one conversations with their child around the act of giving and receiving forgiveness. I urge you all to fully understand the central importance sacramental life for our children and for ourselves. I know that the four family meetings can disrupt routines but this is a small price to pay for the life-giving opportunity the children gain in receiving the Sacraments.

Child Safe Standards – Victorian State Government

A huge amount of work is being completed by schools in Victoria at the moment as we fully implement the new Child Safe Standards as announced by the State Government in Ministerial Order No. 807. The Child Safe Standards have been developed to ensure schools are incorporating policies and procedures that create an environment that will secure our children's safety and keep them from harm. The new standards will have an impact on schools approach to volunteers, contractors that enter the school grounds, camps, excursions, swimming programs and virtually all activities that require adults being in the vicinity of children. Schools in Victoria have until 1st August to implement the Standards.

Sacred Heart Day

Next Friday 3rd June will be Sacred Heart Day and once again we'll be gathering with the students from the College to celebrate mass together at 10.15am. Sr. Geraldine Larkins from the Catholic Education Office will be our special guest at the Mass and we will make our annual presentation to St. Vincent de Paul after the liturgy has been completed. Ron Foley will also be a guest at the celebration and will make the presentation of the BINGO Committee to each school for 2016. During the afternoon, the whole school will participate in a Tabloid Sports run by the Leadership Year 6's.

Online Flaming By Catherine Gerhardt – Part 4

What parents can do:

Evaluate internal feelings this is the best way to tell if one is being flamed. Feelings of anger, aggression, revenge or low mood after reading the text will probably indicate a flaming message. When we feel the strong need to defend ourselves we are likely to react and respond to the text, thereby playing right into the flamer's intent.

Encourage the message "Do Not Respond" The best defence against a flaming comment is to ignore. Do not respond or engage in baiting messages. Once they respond, they have started a conversation. A capable flamer can be cool and composed at first, using kind words and connection to lure the unsuspecting person in. You and your child may not recognise flaming immediately, with many flamers waiting until they get the person to engage in conversation before they attack. Instead, they need to walk away from the comment.

CHILDREN'S CHATTER MATTERS

Activities will be provided each term, focusing on key areas of oral language supporting literacy. Feel free to adjust these activities according to your child's grade level.

Ten activities will be provided over Term Two to help develop your child's vocabulary at home (you may need to adjust the activity to suit your child's level). See if you can think of more activities!



** Play an adjective (describing word) game after reading. Have your child pick an object from one of the pages of their reader. An adjective to describe that object is named e.g. 'big'. All players then take turns to name something that this word describes (no repeats). E.g. big – elephant, mountain, aeroplane, giraffe etc. Then try using them in a sentence.


Sacred Heart Cross Country and Fun Run
