As the period of Lent has started, we should reflect on two significant days that occurred this week.

On Tuesday, Christians around the world celebrate **Shrove Tuesday** or **Pancake Tuesday**. Shrove Tuesday originated when Christians prepared for the 40 days of fasting before Easter. The 'pancakes' were made using all the luxury foods (eggs, flour, milk, etc) that were in each home. These when combined formed a pancake type meal. We now follow this tradition by symbolically making pancakes on Shrove Tuesday.

**Ash Wednesday** is the first day of Lent and occurs forty days before Easter. Ash Wednesday gets its name from the practice of marking

the sign of a cross with ash on the foreheads of the faithful as a sign of repentance. The ashes used, are palm branches gathered and burnt from the previous year's Palm Sunday. For adults Ash Wednesday is a day of fast and abstinence.

As today is Ash Wednesday our Year 1,2 and 3s participated in a Liturgy here at school today while our Yr 4-6s attended Parish Mass. Lent is a special season in the church calendar, where we take time to pray, reflect and fast. This helps us think about what Jesus did for us dying on the cross and to celebrate how he came back to life, on Easter Sunday. Developing Independence in Primary school (Part 2)

Practical ideas for parents to encourage real independence in children.

#### 2. Use pocket money to develop independence

A regular allowance is a fabulous way to promote real independence in children. Start in lower primary school and gradually increase their allowance the older they become. Importantly, you need to increase the areas that their allowance covers. For instance, in lower primary school a child's pocket money might go towards the purchase of some sweets and one or two other items each week. However, in middle primary school it might increase to cover the cost of one or two lunch orders each week, their bus money and some treats.

In later primary school it could even cover some of their clothing purchases as well. The important thing is not to cover for kids if, for instance, they don't budget appropriately and run out of money for school-canteen lunches. They can either make their own lunches at home or perhaps borrow from a sibling and repay out of their next allowance. Pocket money used well is a fantastic way to develop independence in kids.

#### 3. Look after pets

It's a quirk of life that most children want a pet, but they just don't want to look after it in the long term. Many kids discover that following the initial flush of enthusiasm looking after a pet can be a grind – walking the family pooch, cleaning out the guinea-pig cage, or feeding the family feline. But pet care offers priceless lessons in the development of grit, responsibility and nurturance – all necessary attributes for independent success.



#### **CHILDREN'S CHATTER MATTERS**

Language Learning activities to have a go at home.

Activities will be provided over this term targeting phonological awareness skills. Phonological awareness is one of the key building blocks for reading and writing. It is listening to, and thinking about the sounds in words.

\*\* The game, 'Sound Thief', is a great way to support your child to develop their manipulation of sounds in words (deleting, adding or swapping sounds). Use real objects or pictures to represent words, then take turns to steal a target sound. The other player/s need to identify the word and the "sound stolen". For example: hat  $\rightarrow$  "at" (you stole the "h" sound from hat).



As a harder task, try swapping a sound in a word. For example: back  $\Rightarrow$  "ban" (you changed the 'k' sound to an 'n' sound). Decide with your child first the position of the sound to swap – beginning / middle / end.

#### Extend After School Care and Holiday Programs at Sacred Heart Primary School

Last week at After School Care we have a new baseball set that the children are enjoying. For Science, we had an experiment making lemonade fizzy drink. Watching the soda react with the lemon was exciting. The children are asking to set up a school scene most days and acting out their own school day, even acting such things as sickbay & lunch orders. We have been building lots of things with our Lego and setting up scenes like a ranch using our animals and building blocks. We have also been practicing our good manners at ASC.
