Please continue to keep these children in your prayers as they undertake their preparation. Thanks.



Technology & parenting

What rules should you have around digital devices? By Michael Grose Part 2

Children's digital technology needs to be managed and monitored by parents. That means we need to have some rules and guidelines in place. Each family makes up their own rules to suit their circumstances but the following suggestions will help you put some order into the digital devices that come into your home.



1. Hold off as long as you can

The age when a child first gets a mobile phone is getting younger. Now most young people seem to have a mobile phone when they start secondary school. I'm currently working with parents who are struggling to hold off on their child's mobile phone until secondary school but it's a continuous battle as cries of 'everyone else has a phone' is ringing in their ears. If you took all these message from kids seriously you'd think that they were all born holding a mobile device and they've had an Instagram account since they were two.

Kids' pester power works in a way that you tend to feel guilty that you are somehow denying your child a basic right or access to something vital to survival, such as fresh air. Best to develop an easily repeatable mantra such as, "That's great. But every family is different and we do things our way." They may whine when you say it but stick to your own way of parenting, which is not always easy. Alternatively, take the compromise route of allowing a child to borrow your phone, or having a family phone that all kids can use.

2. Be prepared to learn

Giving a digital device to a child has more parent strings attached to it than say, giving a box of Lego or most other items of play. With most toys, you can leave them to their own devices to play by themselves, which is the basic point really. It's not so simple with a digital device. Be prepared to learn some new games and stay up-to-date with social media trends. Snapchat anyone?

3. Put rules in place first

This is an interesting one. If you give your child a device, then later place restrictions on when its overused or used poorly then there's every chance that you'll be seen as the bad guy/gal. Better to put restrictions on in the first place and loosen them later, or better still reward their responsible use with greater freedom. Timing is everything.



CHILDREN'S CHATTER MATTERS

Language Learning activities to have a go at home.

Ten activities will be provided over Term Three to help your child think a little bit deeper about the world around them and to use longer and more complex sentences. Expanding your child's oral language use will lead to significant improvements in their writing also. You may need to adjust the activity to suit your child's level:



** If your child has Show and Tell or News in their class, practise what they will say the day before. Use these picture prompts to guide their language.



For example: Who gave it to you? Where do I use it? What do I do with it? What's it like? (Encourage a detailed description) Use joining words to describe why I brought this item along today. For example: "I like my *brand new* Spongebob toothbrush because it's *really soft* and doesn't hurt my gums."

COMING IN WEEK 7- FREE DENTAL CHECK UP

HAVE YOU RETURNED YOUR FORM? YOU CAN COMPLETE IT ON-LINE TOO!

Sacred Heart Primary School is collaborating with Smiles Onsite to promote healthier, happier smiles at our school! This incredible service is being offered for FREE under the federal government's Child Dental Benefits Schedule (CDBS), and comes along with the chance to grab some amazing prizes.

All students will be given a consent form to bring home so that they can participate, and also so that they can go in the draw to win prizes!!

How does it work?

The Child Dental Benefit Schedule grants all eligible parents with \$1000 worth of Medicare towards dental per child, over a two-year period. Eligible parents should receive a confirmation letter; however if you are still unsure, Smiles Onsite can check for you on completion of their consent form.

Can I make use of this service if I'm not eligible?

Of course! Smiles Onsite can do almost everything that your local dentist can do on board there state-of-the-art mobile Clinic. If you would like them to see your child for a scale and clean, fillings, fissure seals etc., these services can be offered with NO GAP payable.

This service is a great opportunity to get kids into the habit of good oral hygiene, and we hope you're as excited about it as we are!
