
Weekly specialist timetable

STEM and Music are timetabled for the same time each week to enable Live Online Learning sessions.


To accomodate this new method of teaching, a class in each Year Level (apart from Year 1) has been split from students with surnames A-M and students with surnames N-Z.

I know we have lots of animal lovers at Sacred Heart Primary School. Have you or your family checked out the Zoos Victoria website?


Zoos Victoria have set up a few live stream cameras from Melbourne Zoo,
