

10 Golden Rules for Parenting Success in 2015 Michael Grose

The requirements for effective parenting are changing rapidly, just as the profile of parents is changing. Australian parents are now older than ever (30-34 is now the peak child-bearing age group). Families are smaller than ever (over 50% have two children or less). And as children as a percentage of the population shrink (1 in 6 of our population is under 15, compared to 1 in 3 in developing countries), we are less knowledgeable about children than ever.

If you add to this mix that children are growing up at the speed of light, information technology can make parents seem redundant, and increasingly parents claim lack of time is their biggest impediment to effective parenting. So what is a parent to do?



6. Build developmental knowledge

Many challenges parents experience with their children are due to a developmental mismatch. That is, parents raising their ten-year-old as if they are eight. The nuances of parenting are age-related, yet due to inexperience we so often don't read the cues. Recently, I witnessed a mum and dad tearing their hair out trying to communicate with their nine-year-old son. For the first time he was saying no to them. They thought him stubborn and disobedient. I thought him normal, as nine can be a problematic age, where usually malleable children suddenly start changing. Puberty is

stirring. When this couple's second child turns nine she will experience the benefits of her elder brother paving the way and breaking her parents in for her.

Children's Chatter Matters!

Language Learning activities to have a go at, at home.

Ten activities will be provided over this term to help your child think a little bit deeper about the world around them and to use longer and more complex sentences. Expanding your child's oral language use will lead to significant improvements in their writing also. You may

need to adjust the activity to suit your child's level:

** Encourage your child to listen to sounds at the *end* of words. Choose two words from their reader/book and ask them to judge if the two words end with the same sound (say some that match and some that do not). Encourage them to say the words too, and feel the sounds at the end of the words. Then, point out the two sounds at the end.

After mastering this, you might then say two words and ask your child which word has a certain sound at the end. For example, "Which word has the 'd' sound at the end: bed or man (bed)".

Litter Free Lunches

Throughout this term we have noticed that our rubbish has begun to increase again. The children have done a fantastic job changing the way they pack their lunch and helping us to reduce our litter during Term Two, however we need to continue to maintain this change. For the remainder of this term we will focus on reminding and supporting children to continue to reduce their waste.

To help out your child, can you please ensure that any plastic containers are clearly named and remind them to bring home any container or zip lock bags that they take to school. We have a large collection of Tupperware containers that have built up, most of which are unnamed.

Outside bins are still provided for Lunch-order bags and canteen waste. We have been able to reduce our waste and no longer have to empty our bins on a daily basis. We hope to continue this going forward. Thank you for your help.



Apply for a Working With Children Check

Go to http://www.workingwithchildren.vic.gov.au. Go to Apply for a Check.

What you need to fill in for an online application:

- An email address so we can contact you about your application
- the address of every place you have lived in the last 5 years in Australia
- the name, postal address and phone number in Australia for each organisation you will be doing volunteer child related work for
 - a printer that will print a legible copy of the Application summary.

Once you have filled in the online application form, you need to go to a participating Australia Post Retail Outlet to lodge your application. What you take with you when lodging:

- The application summary and receipt that you printed at the end of the online application.
- A passport size photo of yourself
- Documents that prove your identity
- Volunteer WWC Checks are free.

DO NOT SIGN the Application Summary before lodging.

When you have successfully lodged your application at Australia Post, your receipt will be stamped and returned to you. You can use this receipt to prove that you have applied for a WWC Check.

Those people that do not have access to a computer and printer, please do not hesitate to contact the school office and we can arrange to do this first step for you.




